Objectives: We want to discover Paul's motives and approach in shepherding the Thessalonians. We want to apply this by figuring out how to imitate Paul as he imitated Christ (1 Cor. 11:1; 2 Thess. 3:9).

### Launch:

What are right motives that people have in leading others spiritually? What are wrong motives...? What motivates you?

# **Explore:**

Read 1 Thess. 2:1-12

• What is the Big Idea that Paul is trying to communicate in this passage? (*That pleasing God is his motive for ministry.*)

An important technique in interpreting scripture is looking for things that are compared or contrasted.

In this passage what are the major contrasting thoughts that Paul presents (look for the buts)?

- 1&2 He contrasts the idea of their visit being in vain with them sharing the gospel of God in boldness.
- 3&4 Contrasts impure motives with living to please God as their true motive.
- 5/6&7-12 Contrasts what they did not do in ministry with what they did do.

## Verses 1&2

- How would you rephrase verses 1&2 in your own words? What is he contrasting?
- What happened in Philippi?
- Is boldness something you would like more of in your life? Why or why not?
- In light of their reality, why were they able to boldly declare the gospel? In other words, where did the boldness come

from? (in our God or in the presence of God. Paul lists 2 different spheres that he was living in: in God and in the midst of conflict. Which one will dictate your life? If it is in God, you will be bold)

#### Verses 3&4

- What is the contrast Paul is making in 3 and 4?
- Verse 3 starts with "For" or "Because" which shows us that he is answering a question. What is the question Paul is answering? (Why he was able to be bold in much conflict).
- Why were they able to be bold in the midst of much conflict? (He was living to please God and not please man)
- In what ways do you seek to please man as you minister to others?
- Why could Paul live life seeking to please God and not man? He knew he was approved (past tense) by God to be entrusted with the gospel and he knew that God continually was testing (present tense) his heart.
- What pleases God from this passage?
- What needs to change in your life so that you are able to live to please God and not man?

## **Apply:**

Take some time to confess areas where you live to please man instead of God. Pray for one another, that we would be people who live to please God...
